Public Access - Financial Disputes in Divorce

Our barristers can advise you if you and your former partner cannot agree on financial matters during, or after, a divorce. For example, you may not be able to agree on how assets should be divided, whether to sell your home or other assets, maintenance payments, or pension sharing.

If you cannot agree financial matters with your former partner, you can apply to a court for a financial remedy order. You may need to attend a number of court hearings. Our barristers can represent you in these hearings.

Our barristers will guide you expertly through the court process, advising on pre-litigation negotiation and mediation and advising and representing you at the First Appointment, the Financial Dispute Resolution hearing (where most cases are resolved by agreement) and at any final hearing.

Timescales

Timescales for your case may vary depending on factors such as barristers' availability, the value and complexity of your assets, whether you have children, how much you have already agreed with your former partner, and their approach.

Written advice on your financial dispute will be available within two to four weeks where possible.

<u>As a guide</u>, court hearings for a financial remedy order tend to take six to eighteen months. This does not include possible appeals.

Fees

In most cases we charge fixed fees for our work. This which means that we will charge you a set amount of money for each piece of work we undertake. Below we have provided <u>estimates</u> based on the ranges of fixed fees for barristers at Pump Court Chambers.

All fees exclude VAT (where applicable). That means that it is likely that you will have to pay us VAT in addition to the fee at the current rate (presently 20%).

These fees may vary depending on your needs – for example, your fees may be towards the higher end of the range if you need a more experienced barrister and/or you have a more complex case. If you have a particularly complex case, your fees may also be higher than the estimates below. There may also be additional costs for any administrative work involved such as copying or where you agree to engage another person to assist with your case, such as a paralegal. On the first occasion that you instruct us there will be a fixed administration fee of £20 plus Vat.

When quoting fees it will only be to undertake that particular piece of work. There are likely to be many different pieces of work involved in a case such as representation at hearings, advising in conference and in writing and drafting documents. We will always quote separately for each piece of work. Please contact us so we can discuss fees individually with you.

Our barristers range in experience and expertise from QCs to newly qualified barristers. The fee levels set out below will reflect the relative experience of the barrister that you decide to instruct.

Fixed Fees

Stage of case	Ranges of fixed fees (estimates)
Preliminary Conference	£750 - £5,000
Written advice on your claim	£750 - £5,000
Preparation of case, including meetings with you and assistance with drafting of any Court documents	The fixed fee would be calculated at the hourly rate of the appointed Counsel multiplied by the number of hours work required.
	The applicable range of hourly rates are £125 - £500 per hour.
First Appointment hearing (first court hearing normally associated with exchanging of financial information and documents, provision of expert evidence and identifying the issues in the case)	£750 - £5,000
Financial Dispute Resolution Hearing (second court hearing to discuss possible financial settlement)	£1,000 - £10,000
1 Day Final Hearing (if no financial settlement has been agreed)	£1,500 - £12,000
Part Heard day(s) of final hearing (per day, following day one)	£850 - £5,000
